SUMMARY REPORT ON THE STATUS OF EFFORTS TO ADDRESS GENDER BASED VIOLENCE AND SORCERY ACCUSATION RELATED VIOLENCE IN ENGA PROVINCE

INTRODUCTION

This report provides summaries of discussions held with the key stakeholders during the consultation process from the 9th to the 12th of May 2023, to understand and establish the current trends on the progress of their collective efforts in addressing gender based violence and sorcery accusation related violence in the province.

The key stakeholders consulted were:

- a. Family Support Centre staff at the Wabag General Hospital
- b. Civil Society Organizations recognized as frontline Service Providers in this space
- c. Police (Rural commanders, Family Sexual Violence Unit Officers and Sexual Offence Squad Officers)
- d. Law and Justice services
- e. Child and Family services (Child Protection)

These stakeholders were consulted on their services targeted towards prevention and response activities in addressing gender based violence and sorcery accusation related violence.

OVERVIEW OF GBV AND SARV IN ENGA PROVINCE

In January 2021, the Enga Provincial Government passed the resolution that established the Enga Provincial Family and Sexual Violence Committee chaired by the Deputy Provincial Administrator Social Services, Mr. John Iso. An annual funding of K70, 000.00 was committed to support the operation of this Committee. Since its inception, this Committee prioritized the development of the Enga Provincial GBV Prevention and Response Strategy and Work Plan 2023 – 2026, and delegated that task to Dr. Betty Koka (Director – Public Health, Enga Provincial Health Authority) and Mrs. Dorothy

Kukum (acting Director, Community Development) as the Sub-Committee (Enga Provincial GBV Plan) with the Secretariat at the Community Development division.

With support from our partners namely, UNDP, Department for Community Development & Religion and the National GBV Secretariat, the Enga Provincial GBV Prevention and Response Strategy and Work Plan 2023 – 2026 is now in its revised draft from 2022, to be validated in June 2023 and vetted to the Provincial Executive Council for implementation.

The civil society organizations (CSOs aka non-State actors) are the key frontline service providers in both response and prevention services to the victims/survivors and the perpetrators. Their efforts are then aided by the Police (FSVU) and the Health (FSCU).

Therefore, much of the real-time data are with the CSOs while reported cases at the Police (FSVU) and the Health (FCSU).

There is only one (1) operating Family and Sexual Violence Unit (FSVU) in Enga, at the Porgera District, while the five (5) districts including the provincial headquarters does not have operating FSVUs. This gap makes data collection difficult so it remains a huge challenge to date.

In addition, there is one (1) operating Family Support Centre Unit (FSCU) in Wabag General Hospital that responds to all emergency cases that are reported on arrival. Few of the GBV/SARV cases that CSOs response to are Wabag FSCU while most are rescued and supported through their network partners outside of Enga Province, such as Oxfam International (Goroka, Eastern Highlands Province), Voice for Change (Banz, Jiwaka Province) and Kafe Women's Association (Goroka, Eastern Highlands Province). This also makes reporting of data and related services provided difficult to report within the province.

With support from the National GBV Secretariat (NGBVS), office items (filing cabinets, tables and chairs with office stationaries and a laptop) were supplied. An office space is available, however, needs minor renovation work to accommodate the operation of the Enga Provincial GBV Secretariat at the Community Development division.

Presently, a consultation meeting is scheduled in June for the engagement of all CSOs and development partners to foster collaboration in the implementation of the Enga Provincial GBV Prevention and Response Strategy and Work Plan 2023 -2026. Through this effort regular reporting from all parties will advise, inform and improve collaboration in our prevention and response strategies to address GBV/SARV challenges.

PROVINCIAL GBV STRATEGY

The Enga Provincial Government, through its Provincial Executive Council passed resolution No.03 of 2021 on the 15th of January 2021 and approved the establishment of the Enga Provincial Family and Sexual Violence Action Committee (FSVAC).

In March 2021, the first meeting held by the Enga Provincial FSVAC was to develop the Enga Provincial GBV Prevention and Response Strategy 2022 – 2025 and its work plan.

Here is the summary of key activities to be implemented under the strategy:

OBJECTIVE 1: To ensure that by 2026, Enga province has a functioning GBV governance and institutional structure supporting the achievement of zero tolerance towards GBV, aligned with the Enga Provincial Strategic Development Plan 2022-2030, PNG Development Plan, Papua New Guinea Vision 2050 and with the Sustainable Development Goals 2016-2030,

OUTCOME 1: Improved governance and institutional structure for culturally appropriate GBV prevention and response in Enga Province

OUTPUT 1.1. Provincial GBV Secretariat staffed and Provincial GBV Action Committee established and adequately supported to coordinate the implementation of Enga Provincial GBV Strategy 2023 -2026

In 2023, the Enga Provincial Government has already committed K70, 000.00 for gender based violence and the above priority activities have been year-marked for implementation.

As indicated, the National GBV Secretariat and various development partners such as UNDP, JSS4D, UNICEF, UN Women, UNFPA, EU and others will now be consulted for collaboration to implement these activities.

PROVINCIAL GBV SECRETARIAT AND ACTION COMMITTEE

The Enga Provincial GBV Secretariat presently operates in the Community Development division. The new GBV Secretariat office requires minor renovations to create that office space.

Presently the Action Committee members are:

a. Chairperson - Deputy Provincial Administrator, Social Services

b. Secretariat - Director, Community Development

c. Member - Director, Law & Order

d. Member - Director, Public Health, Enga Provincial Health Authority

e. Member - Senior Provincial Magistrate

f. Member - Police Station Commander (Provincial Headquarters)

g. Member - Provincial Legal Officer

Presently, there is no GBV/SARV designated Officer so the Director, Community Development has been the Focal Point since 2021.

Going forward, the Enga Provincial Government has already approved 12 new positions with the implementation of the Lukautim Pikinini Act 2015; where a GBV/SARV-Child Protection Officer will perform the functions and responsibilities targeting the same population for improved service delivery (see Outcome 1).

PROVINCIAL GBV AND SARV CRISIS RESPONSE AND JUSTICE SERVICES

The Human Rights Defenders network from the Caritas Wabag (Catholic Church) and Tribal Foundation (in partnership with Lutheran church) have been the leading CSOs in response, together with the Rural Commanding team (Wabag, Porgera and Kandep) from the Police.

Due to lack of FSVU presence in the 5 Districts (Wapenamanda, Wabag, Kompiam, Laiagam and Kandep) GBV/SARV cases are reported at the main counter of Police stations as rape and/or sexual assault cases, and are not followed through/thoroughly for prosecution. When GBV/SARV cases go through the FSCU in Wabag General Hospital, the cases are treated and cared for until the survivors are discharged and the Human Rights Defenders network follow-up with these cases for rehabilitation and reintegration back into the communities to the preference of the survivors. In almost all reported cases the perpetrators have yet to be prosecuted.

In 2023, the Enga Provincial GBV Prevention & Response Strategy 2023-2026 and work plan will foster a united actions by State actors, non-State actors and development partners to preventing GBV/SARV cases and responding to call-outs from the communities. Furthermore, effective coordination and monitoring of these activities; specifically capacity development as well as exposure to evidence based practices in the country, will add value to our efforts going forward.

The main focus now is to build and strengthen the referral pathways, develop standard operating procedures of the reporting mechanism and establish FSVU operations in all the five (5) districts for access to justice services by informed citizens.

Recently, the Caritas Wabag at Sari Parish (Catholic) provided Safe House services to some of the Survivors who were discharged from the hospital (FSCU) and now receiving care and counselling services. After that they will be reintegrated into their preferred locality with relatives who are willing to embrace them into the community.

PROVINCIAL GBV AND SARV PREVENTION AND AWARENESS RAISING ACTIVITIES

It has been the Christian Churches in Enga as well as other non-State actors that are very proactive in raising awareness on GBV, SARV, and violence against children, girls and women. Annually, the Enga Provincial Council of Churches conduct awareness of GBV, SARV, drugs, alcohol and substance abuse.

In the Enga Provincial GBV Prevention & Response Strategy 2023-2026, Outcome 4 focuses on improving prevention and advocacy interventions for reducing gender based violence at all levels and in all sectors of society.

This calls for an enhanced collaboration amongst the State and non-State actors to effectively and efficiently improve and increase awareness coverage in all the 355 wards in the 17 local government areas of the 6 Districts in Enga Province.

RECOMMENDATIONS FOR IMPROVEMENT

The Enga Provincial GBV Prevention and Response Strategy 2023-2026 and its work plan clearly charts the way forward, beginning with the 2023 Annual Activities outlined in brief summary.

There is an urgency now for the establishment of FSVU presence and operations in Wapenamanda, Kompiam, Wabag, Laiagam and Kandep for reports to come in. Police personnel serving in the FSVU must be trained and well-resourced to execute their duties without fear or favour.

It is imperative that the reported GBV/SARV cases be prosecuted and the perpetrators, at large, be arrested and brought to the District Court.

The Ward Councillors must be a frontline service provider, through the Ward Development Committee, with prevention interventions supported through the Local Level Government councils. They are the Government Presence where the people are, and they know very well who the perpetrators and victims/survivors are; and so, they will make an effective Community Partner. Therefore, Ward Councillors and their Ward Committees must be trained to become proactive and responsive to the behaviour of the citizens in their respective wards.
